Where do YOU go in times of need, temptation, or failure?

- 1. Our great high priest has paved the way for us.
 - A. Jesus became our great high priest through the blood of His cross and the power of His resurrection.

Therefore, He had to be made like His brethren in all things, that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. Hebrews 2:17

B. Jesus <u>sat down</u> at the right hand of the throne of God.

And every priest stands daily ministering and offering time after time the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins; but He, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, SAT DOWN AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD, waiting from that time onward UNTIL HIS ENEMIES BE MADE A FOOTSTOOL FOR HIS FEET. For by one offering He has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. Hebrews 10:11-14

C. Jesus lives to <u>make intercession for us</u>.

Hence, also, He is able to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them. Hebrews 7:25

2. Our great high priest has sympathy for us.

- A. Jesus can relate to us in <u>our weaknesses</u>.
- B. Jesus knows exactly what it is like to be tempted.

And now he can help those who are tempted, because he himself was tempted and suffered. Hebrews 2:18 GNB

3. Our great high priest has made a throne a grace for us.

- A. We can come to God with confidence because of Jesus.
- B. We can come to God and receive mercy and more grace.
