What are the lessons found in the story of Rahab the harlot?

1. The LORD will judge sin.

... and in righteousness He judges and wages war. Revelation 19:11

A. Jericho was a wicked city destined for total destruction.



B. Rahab was an immoral woman covered in sin and shame.

2. The LORD will save the worst of sinners who trusts in Him.

Rahab heard about the LORD and trusted Him.

"Turn to Me, and be saved, all the ends of the earth; For I am God, and there is no other. Isaiah 45:22

- A. Rahab <u>risked her life</u> to save the LORD'S spies.
- B. Rahab had a <u>burden for her family</u> to be saved.

C. Rahab hung the scarlet cord, a picture of redemption.

"Come now, and let us reason together," Says the LORD, "Though your sins are as scarlet, They will be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They will be like wool. If you consent and obey, You will eat the best of the land; But if you refuse and rebel, You will be devoured by the sword." Truly, the mouth of the LORD has spoken. Isaiah 1:18-21

- D. Rahab is included in the lineage of Jesus Christ.
 ... and to Salmon was born Boaz by Rahab; and to Boaz was
 born Obed by Ruth; and to Obed, Jesse; and to Jesse was
 born David the king. Matthew 1:5-6
