## What is the truth about shattered dreams?

## 1. Everyone experiences some shattered dreams.

A. God never promised a life without <u>difficulties</u>. Here on earth you will have many trials and sorrows. John 16:33 NLT

B. God sometimes allows His children to experience more.

## 2. When your dreams shatter, the devil moves in.

A. He wants you to <u>be consumed with pity</u>. No, my daughters; for it is harder for me than for you... Ruth 1:13

B. He wants you to <u>blame God</u>. *The LORD Himself has raised His fist against me. Ruth 1:13* 

"The Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me. I went out full, but the LORD brought me back empty. Why do you call me Naomi, since the LORD has witnessed against me and the Almighty has afflicted me?" Ruth 1:20-21

C. He wants you to <u>get bitter</u>. Do not call me Naomi; call me Mara... Ruth 1:20

A. He has special promises.
